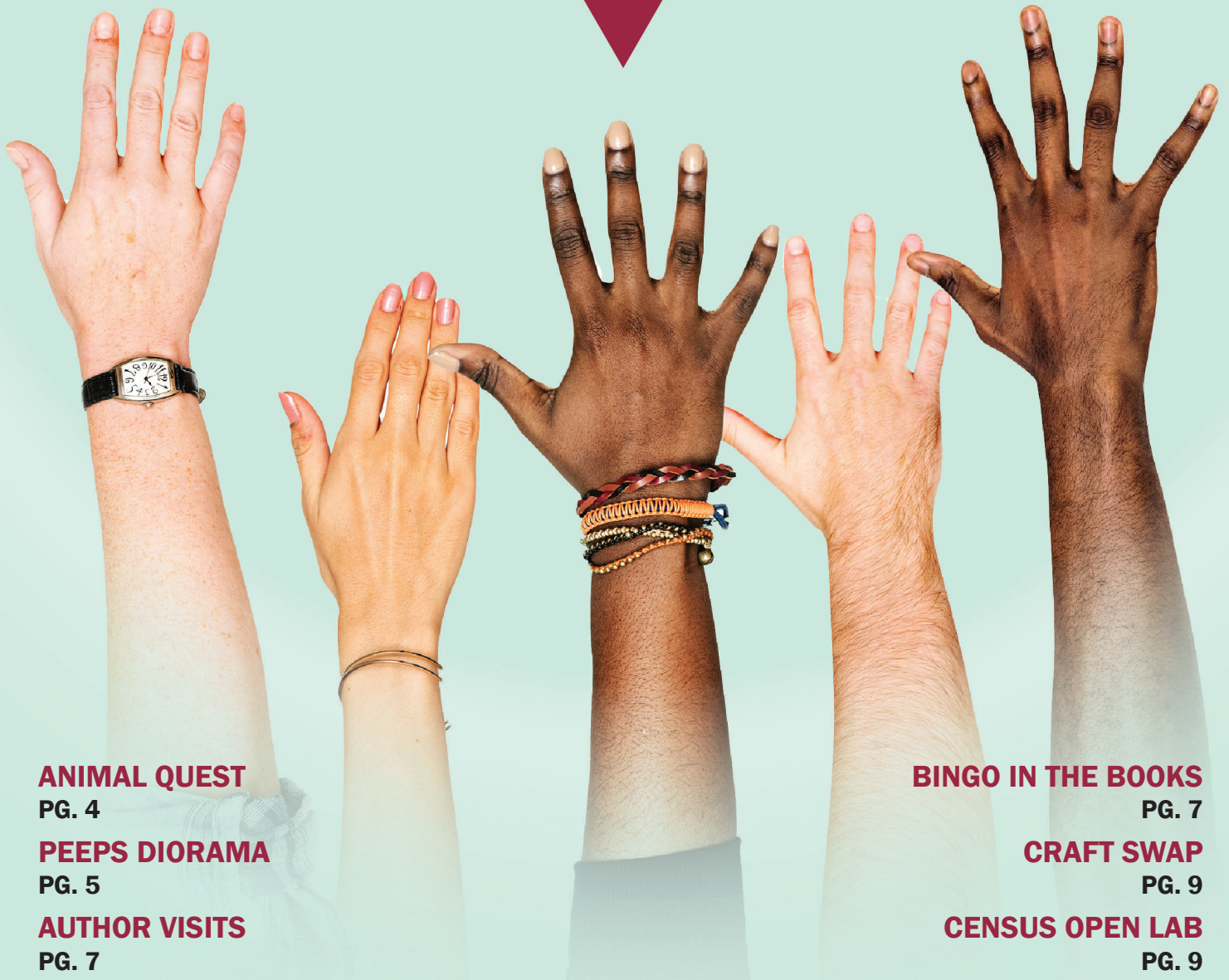

FROM THE DIRECTOR

Make Your Voice Count

In the coming weeks, you will have two unique opportunities to make your voice heard. The Warren-Newport Public Library is developing a **strategic plan** to take the library into the next decade and beyond. We need your help. Your input is vital to enhancing and developing services for our community in the future.

Are you ready to move forward with us? At www.wnpl.info/StratPlan2020, you can take the community survey (in English or Spanish), review the timeline, and read the 2016 strategic plan. As the Board of Trustees and library staff continue planning, we hope to make great strides towards achieving our vision.



Speaking of vision, decisions made from the **Census 2020** count will affect our lives for more than 10 years. Once a decade, the U.S. Census Bureau launches a sweeping effort to count everyone in America's diverse and growing population. This data is the basis for reapportioning Congressional seats, redistricting electoral boundaries, and distributing \$675 billion in federal funding to support state and local programs. The impact of uncounted individuals in the Census is underfunded schools, libraries and other essential services. Our area will lose an estimated **\$1,000** per year in federal funds for every person that does not get counted!

When you receive a postcard, paper survey or visit from a Census enumerator, please make sure you and all of your family members are counted. For the first time in Census history, information can be collected online or via phone. (Find out how at <https://www.2020census.gov/> and see page 9 in this newsletter for Census Open Lab dates and times.) Information is anonymous and confidential. By law (Title 13 of the U.S. Code), Census records cannot be made public for 72 years. (That's a long time from now!)



The future is in *your* hands. Make your voice count—help Warren-Newport Public Library District move forward by taking the strategic plan community survey, then be counted in Census 2020. Your voice, combined with voices of your neighbors, will assist in significant decision-making for our communities for years to come!
